Helping research staff to succeed

Academic Job Search

If you are considering or seeking employment in the academic sector, this tip-sheet will help you to identify how to prepare for the job hunt abroad. There are useful links for further research.

1. Top tips

- Talk to your Principal Investigator (PI) and others in your field to find out where the top groups are.
- Start by doing some background research into the institution/country you would like to work in. Do you know any colleagues where you would like to apply to? If not, do your colleagues know anyone? Contact them and ask for advice on how the academic job market operates.
- If you have identified a group leader who you would like to work with, make contact by phone or email. Share what interests or contacts you have in common and ask for further information. This might lead to future opportunities or simply ensure that you are known when a job is advertised.
- Be aware that types of research/academic employers differ from country to country. To give just two examples: Germany has more research institutes than the UK; and the US has different types of universities, with differing levels of research infrastructure.
- Note that different academic opportunities exist in different countries. For instance, there are fewer postdoc positions in France, but there are more permanent roles for research staff who teach without being group leaders.
- Look for professional associations and learned societies in the country you are interested in. For example, there are societies for mechanical engineers in the UK, Canada, Australia, the US, Japan, and China. These often feature job advice, mailing lists, and job boards.
- Investigate whether there is a research staff association in the country you are considering moving to (see <u>ICoRSA</u> (International Consortium of Research Staff Associations).
- Check for associations of researchers from your home country at your destination, e.g. there is an <u>association</u> for Portuguese researchers working in the UK.
