Global Challenges: Collecting & Understanding Data
Global Challenges: Innovating for Change

Project details: 'Dear Diary' is a project that involves students and staff writing weekly diary entries to explore different perspectives on a first-year undergraduate module running from October to December 2019.

Following each session of the module, all participants will need to make notes in their diaries – which may include descriptive writing, brief notes, diagrams, drawings or other forms of notation. Each participant will be creating their own mini-research project in researching their own experience. Ultimately, participants will use their diaries to present an account of their overall experience that will be shared at a final seminar.

The project will involve sixteen students in total, eight undergraduate student partners, eight co-learners (PhD students) and three staff members. All the staff and student partners will be participating in the 8-week first-year modules listed above. Participants will be given an initial briefing, continuous support, and a debriefing on how to write a final account of their experience. In total the project will require a commitment of no more than 15 hours from each participant.
