



StudentShapers: Partnership description

Developing online learning to aid transition to Master's level study in FoM

Bursary: £50 per week x 17 weeks = Total of £850.00

Your role: As StudentShapers you will act as partners and co-creators in designing an online pre-arrival course to aid the transition to Master's level study in FoM, regarding aspects such as content and method of online delivery. Whilst much of the content and rationale regarding the pre-arrival course has been planned to an extent, there is flexibility in this and hence an opportunity for you to directly influence the aims and intended outcomes for this online learning, in order for the course to best meet student needs. Furthermore, whilst broad aims and plans have somewhat already been established (as previously mentioned), these need to be realised into concrete course design; as StudentShapers you will be integral to this process in moving from theory towards a tangible output. You will decide with staff how an authentic partnership will work most effectively within the time available, however it is anticipated that you will likely be involved in the course development process in the following ways:

- Regular face-to-face meetings to orientate you regarding the aims and rationale of the project, and to establish expectations for the student-staff partnership
- You may review, critique and develop current project plans for course design, such as intended learning outcomes
- You may, individually or in partnership with a fellow StudentShaper or staff member, design and develop specific sections of the online pre-arrival course
- You may, individually or in partnership with a fellow StudentShaper or staff member, review, critique and provide feedback on specific sections of the online course that have been designed/ developed by a fellow student or staff partner(s)
- You may engage with various stakeholders to further inform the design of the online pre-arrival course

Application criteria: In order to apply, you must be a current Master's student from the Faculty of Medicine (or a PhD student providing they have recently studied at Master's level within this Faculty)

Expected skill development/outcomes:

- An opportunity to work in partnership with Imperial staff to act as co-creators in the development of an educational resource to enhance the student experience in Postgraduate Medicine
- To experience working on a direct output of the College's Learning & Teaching Strategy
- To receive financial support for your contribution
- An opportunity to potentially present your work internally and/or externally in partnership with staff
