The central careers team are looking for a StudentShaper to partner with us to investigate how current and recently graduated students have successfully secured internships, graduate schemes, and other careers related opportunities since March 2020. What do these students wish they had known at the start of this process? What are the concerns of students about to embark on this process? Working alongside with a Careers Consultant you will help shape key questions to focus on and formulate a plan to research them.

Drawing on your own knowledge and experiences you will also consider a wide range of student perspectives to ensure the project outcomes meet the needs of the student population at Imperial. You will be actively involved in setting both the research parameters and determining how the knowledge gained can be translated into accessible and useful resources e.g., cases studies, website pages, booklet, short videos or something entirely different.

At the end of the project you will be invited to present the results of your research and final resources to the Careers Services team. This may also include suggestions to enhance the current offering the central Careers Service provides.
