The making of a doctor: cross-disciplinary learning in medical education

Who should apply?

We welcome applications from all students currently enrolled in the Imperial College MBBS programme. If you are interested in education and educational research we would love to hear from you. Previous research experience is not mandatory!

Campus/Location:

Imperial College Centre for Engagement and Simulation Science (ICCESS) based at Chelsea and Westminster Hospital.

Project details:

We are looking for a StudentShaper to participate in the development of an exciting new educational initiative exploring the value of cross-disciplinary learning - where seemly unrelated specialities exchange perspectives to gain insights from one another.

The student joining our team will engage with non-health care professionals affiliated with the Royal College of Music Imperial Centre for Performance Science. This will include musicians, performing artists, chefs, and fine artists. Supported by the clinical staff at ICCESS, they will explore how insights gained from these professionals (for example skills in communication, teamwork, dexterity, expertise development, or leadership) can be utilised in medical education. In partnership with the ICCESS Clinical Teaching Fellow (lead staff partner on this project), they will build a proposal for interactive workshops which explore these insights within the undergraduate medical curriculum.

This 6 week full time partnership will run between the 1st of July and the 11th of August 2020 and represents the first phase (design) in our project to implement a novel educational intervention. The StudentShaper may also collaborate with the staff partners as we plan the second phase of educational research, to pilot workshops during 2020/2021 academic year. There is no expectation of ongoing significant time commitment after completion of the StudentShapers programme.
