

StudentShapers Recruitment: Calling all EEE/EIE students

Development of the Imperial EEWiki

Bursary: £390 per week for 5 weeks full time work (exact dates tbc but to take place over summer 2024).

Who should apply: We are looking for 3 EEE/EIE undergraduate students to act as student partners on the project. These partners would have a range of favourite topics and areas of interest and ideally be from different years in the undergraduate programme (we are aware that year 3 students are on industrial placement over summer – if you are in year 3 but this project inspires you then please do apply and provide details on your availability and we can see if the dates can work around your placement/recruit you at part-time if feasible). We are looking for partners who are passionate about enhancing the learning experience of future students in the EEE department.

Campus/Location: South Kensington, though we will most likely take meetings remotely so the project can almost fully run remotely.

Project details:

Across Imperial, in collaboration with staff from respective departments, wiki pages containing core content from the degree programmes within each department have been developed and written by students.

The aim of such is to provide the content in an alternative flavour (for example with more focus on worked examples or on breaking down a problem into additional steps) or in a different style to that of the material provided by teaching staff. Many students have found these alternative resources to be beneficial to their learning.

This project calls upon its recruited student partners to use their skills and passion for content creation and development to build the initial stages of a high-quality resource: the EEWiki, for use to supplement teaching and learning in the EEE department. The project will involve a discussion and investigation into what resources would be best to focus on initial development, development of these resources and also cast an eye to the future sustainability and use of these resources throughout the department.

A strong programming background is not essential for the project, but due to the nature of the work involved (development of online resources) a level of competency with programming and the use of typesetting languages (such as latex) is preferred.
