Do you want to help shape prescribing teaching throughout the Primary Care Curriculum?

Bursary: £1430 (3 hours/week for six months/26 weeks in total)

Who should apply: Students enrolled on the MBBS in years 3,4,5 and 6 are eligible to apply.

Campus/Location: Reynolds Building, Charing Cross Campus on Wednesday or Thursday (with potential for some remote involvement).

Project details: This is an exciting opportunity to consider how we can best integrate prescribing teaching into the Primary Care courses of the medical curriculum. Recent student feedback has highlighted that students want more prescribing teaching integrated throughout the undergraduate medical curriculum. We propose to review and map prescribing teaching across the current medical curriculum from a primary care perspective, with the aim to understand the current offering and identify areas to develop new prescribing initiatives aimed at improving student learning and better preparing students for clinical practice. Following this scoping and mapping exercise, we will co-develop innovation(s) to help address gaps identified and further enhance any current teaching offered.

This project will involve two students working collaboratively with our team. As a student shaper on this project, you will have the opportunity to:

- Be involved in every stage of curriculum design
- Consider how best to adapt current materials
- Co-create & evaluate new learning materials

This will provide you with a unique opportunity to develop your educational skills and understanding of the process of curricular development. We hope to disseminate this work in partnership with you through possible publications and presentations.
